FINAL ORDER TERMINATING PRACTICE MONITORING

NOW on this 10th day of June, 2016, comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") the request of Ethan Bickelhaupt, MD ("Licensee") for termination of the Practice Monitoring provision of his Consent Order filed on December 23, 2014. Licensee appears in person and *pro se*. Jane Weiler, Associate Litigation Counsel, appears on behalf of the Respondent Board.

Pursuant to the authority granted to Board by K.S.A. 65-2801 et seq., and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act K.S.A. 77-501 et seq., the Board hereby enters this Final Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the agency record, hearing the statements and arguments of the parties, receiving evidence, and being otherwise advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

- 1. On December 23, 2014, Licensee entered into a Consent Order to as a condition of reinstating his license. The Consent Order contains a provision that Licensee have a practice monitor for at least one year, with a provision that at the end of one year, Licensee may request termination of that provision.
- 2. On March 9, 2016, Licensee submitted a request to the Board for termination of the Practice Monitoring provision of the Consent Order.

- 3. On May 10, 2016, the Respondent Board filed a Response to Petition for Termination of Practice Monitoring and submitted exhibits demonstrating Licensee's compliance with the Consent Order's Practice Monitoring requirements.
- 4. The Board finds that Licensee has satisfactorily met all requirements of the Practice Monitoring provision of the Consent Order and concludes that termination of the Practice Monitoring is warranted in the circumstances.
- 5. All other requirements of the Consent Order shall remain in full force and effect as written.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF

HEALING ARTS that the Practice Monitoring required by the Consent Order filed on

December 23, 2014, is hereby TERMINATED.
