CONSENT ORDER

COMES NOW the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), by and through Stacy L. Cook, Litigation Counsel ("Petitioner"), and Todd H. Eck, D.C. ("Licensee"), by and through attorney Ryan E. Hodge, and move the Board for approval of a Consent Order affecting Licensee's license to practice chiropractic in the State of Kansas. The parties stipulate and agree to the following.

- Licensee's last known address to the Board is 642 Dublin Drive, Andover,
 Kansas 67002.
- 2. Licensee is or has been entitled to engage in the practice of chiropractic in the State of Kansas, having been issued License No. 01-03922 on December 9, 1988. Licensee last renewed his license on December 18, 2003. Licensee's license status is active.
- 3. The Board is the sole and exclusive administrative agency in the State of Kansas authorized to regulate the practice of the healing arts, specifically the practice of chiropractic. K.S.A. 65-2869.
- 4. This Consent Order and the filing of such document are in accordance with applicable law and the Board has jurisdiction to enter into the Consent Order as provided by K.S.A. 65-2838. Upon approval, these stipulations shall constitute the findings of the Board, and this Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Final Order.

- 5. The Kansas Healing Arts Act is constitutional on it face and as applied in this case.
- 6. Licensee agrees that, in considering this matter, the Board is not acting beyond its jurisdiction as provided by law.
- 7. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to a hearing. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to present a defense by oral testimony and documentary evidence, to submit rebuttal evidence, and to conduct cross-examination of witnesses. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly agrees to waive all possible substantive and procedural motions and defenses that could be raised if an administrative hearing were held.
- 8. The terms and conditions of the Consent Order are entered into between the under signed parties and are submitted for the purpose of allowing these terms and conditions to become and Order of the Board. This Consent Order shall not be binding on the Board until an authorized signature is affixed at the end of this document.

 Licensee specifically acknowledges that counsel for the Board is not authorized to sign the Consent Order on behalf of the Board.
- 9. On approximately January 28, 2004, Licensee advertised his services in the Newton Kansan.
- 10. The advertisement refers to the practitioner as "Dr. Eck." The advertisement does not identify the branch of healing arts in which Licensee holds a license.
 - 11. The advertisement contains several false and/or misleading statements.

- 12. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836 and 65-2837, the Board has grounds to take disciplinary action against Licensee's license.
- 13. In lieu of the conclusion of formal proceedings, Licensee, by signature affixed to this Consent Order, hereby voluntarily agrees to the following disciplinary action with respect to his license to engage in the practice of chiropractic:
 - a. Licensee is hereby publicly censured;
 - Licensee shall pay a fine in the amount of \$2,500. Such fine is due and payable to the Board of Healing Arts on or before May 17,
 2004;
 - c. Licensee shall include his first name in all advertisements; and
 - d. Licensee shall follow all applicable statutes and rules and regulations regarding advertising.
- 14. Licensee's failure to comply with the provisions of the Consent Order may result in the Board taking further disciplinary action as the Board deems appropriate according to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act.
- 15. Nothing in this Consent Order shall be construed to deny the Board jurisdiction to investigate alleged violations of the Healing Arts Act, or to investigate complaints received under the Risk Management Law, K.S.A. 65-4921 *et seq.*, that are known or unknown and are not covered under this Consent Order, or to initiate formal proceedings based upon known or unknown allegations of violations of the Healing Arts Act.
- 16. Licensee hereby releases the Board, its individual members (in their official and personal capacities), attorneys, employees and agents, hereinafter

collectively referred to as ("Releasees"), from any and all claims, including but not limited to, those alleged damages, actions, liabilities, both administrative and civil, including the Kansas Act for Judicial Review and Civil Enforcement of Agency Actions, K.S.A. 77-601 *et seq.*, arising out of the investigation and acts leading to the execution of this Consent Order. This release shall forever discharge the Releasees of any and all claims or demands of every kind and nature that Licensee has claimed to have had at the time of this release or might have had, either known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and Licensee shall not commence to prosecute, cause or permit to be prosecuted, any action or proceeding of any description against the Releasees.

- 17. Licensee further understands and agrees that upon signature by Licensee, this document shall be deemed a public record and shall be reported to the National Practitioner Databank, and any other reporting entities requiring disclosures of the Consent Order.
- 18. This Consent Order, when signed by both parties, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may only be modified or amended by a subsequent document executed in the same manner by the parties.
- 19. Licensee agrees that information maintained by the Board pertaining to the nature and result of any complaint and/or investigation may be fully disclosed to and considered by the Board in conjunction with the presentation of any offer of settlement, even if Licensee is not present. Licensee further acknowledges that the Board may conduct further inquiry as it deems necessary before the complete or partial acceptance or rejection of any offer of settlement.

- 20. Licensee, by signature to this document, waives any objection to the participation of the Board members, including the Disciplinary Panel, in the consideration of this offer of settlement and agrees not to seek the disqualification or recusal of any Board member in any future proceedings on the basis that the Board member has received investigative information from any source which otherwise may not be admissible or admitted as evidence.
- 21. Licensee acknowledges that he has read this Consent Order and fully understands the contents.
- 22. Licensee acknowledges that this Consent Order has been entered into freely and voluntarily.
- 23. All correspondence or communication between Licensee and the Board relating to this Consent Order shall be certified mail addressed to the Kansas Board of Healing Arts, Attn: Stacy L. Cook, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, Kansas 66603-3068.
- 24. Licensee shall obey all federal, state and local laws and rules governing the practice of chiropractic in the State of Kansas that may be in place at the time of execution of the Consent Order or may become effective subsequent to the execution of this document.
- 25. Upon execution of this Consent Order by affixing a Board authorized signature below, the provisions of this Consent Order shall become an Order under K.S.A. 65-2838. This Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Order when filed with the Office of the Executive Director for the Board and no further Order is required.
- 26. The Board may consider all aspects of this Consent Order in any future matter regarding Licensee.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Consent Order and agreement of the parties contained herein is adopted by the Board as findings of fact and conclusions of law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in lieu of the conclusion of formal proceedings, Licensee, by signature affixed to this Consent Order, hereby voluntarily agrees to the following disciplinary action with respect to his license to engage in the practice of chiropractic:

- a. Licensee is hereby publicly censured;
- Licensee shall pay a fine in the amount of \$2,500. Such fine is due
 and payable to the Board of Healing Arts on or before May 17,
 2004;
- c. Licensee shall include his first name in all advertisements; and
- d. Licensee shall follow all applicable statutes and rules and regulations regarding advertising.
