FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING CONFERENCE HEARING

NOW, on this 23rd day of June, 1995, this matter comes on for consideration before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereafter "Board") sitting as a whole as Presiding Officer in a conference proceeding pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 77-533 through 77-535, the request submitted by Tariq Bin Masud Niazi, M.D. (hereafter "Applicant") for waiver of completion of Section X entitled "Certificate of Professional College" on the Application for Endorsement for a license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Kansas received February 6, 1995. Charlene Abbott presented information regarding this matter to the Board. Applicant did not appear.

After reviewing the request and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

1. On February 6, 1995, Applicant filed an Application for Endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

- 2. As part of that application, Applicant had not completed Section X of the application entitled "Certificate of Professional College".
- 3. By letter dated March 13, 1995, Applicant requested the Board to waive the requirement for completion of Section X of the Application. Applicant had made repeated requests to have Section X completed and sent to the Board office from the Khyber Medical College in Pakistan, but due to the political atmosphere in Pakistan, the Section X certificate has not been provided by the college Dean and it is not anticipated that the information is forthcoming.
- 4. Applicant has provided evidence in the form of copies of documents provided to the Maine Board of Medicine which contains information similar to that contained in Section X and also notarized copies of documents from the Principal of Khyber Medical College.
- 5. The information provided by Applicant in support of the application is in substantial conformity with the requirements of K.A.R. 100-8-2(e).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED as follows:

- A. That the findings here and above made be and the same are made the Order of the Board.
- B. Applicant has provided the information in substantial conformity with K.A.R. 100-8-2 and the requirement of completion of Section X of the Application should be waived.

C. Applicant's application should be placed on the Board agenda for final approval and issuance of a permanent license at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board; in the interim Applicant, upon payment of the appropriate fee, is entitled to receive a temporary permit under K.S.A. 65-2811(a)(1).

D. This is a Final Order and is effective upon service upon the parties. Any party may, within fifteen (15) days after service file a petition to review this order within fifteen days after service of this Order file a Petition for Reconsideration. A Petition for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
